For Your sake, I suffer...

There are many points of resemblance between the prophetic mission of our Lord and that of the Hebrew prophets, and especially this weekend in the way the prophet Jeremiah was persecuted and entrapped. He had been busy telling the king of Judah and the nobles in Jerusalem that they were in grave error and had to turn back to God and be destroyed. He was imprisoned and several times near execution. In the gospel reading, we can see Christ instructing his priests to follow in His own footsteps and be new Jeremiahs, fearlessly calling out the priests and the leaders of the people. It is a call to martyrdom, and one which would have echoed in the ears of the martyrs of the Church of every age. We are in the midst of pilgrimage season, and this Sunday the Diocese remembers S. Ralph Sherwin at Rodsley, near Derby. Last week, we had the feast day of S. John Fisher and S. Thomas More. All of them defended the Church against the king. This week we honour the Apostles S. Peter and S. Paul. We are to be proud of the name of Christian, as we confess publicly to Christ.
